Report From Standing Committees/ -0-

Sewer/ -0-

Parks/All employees for the 2018 pool season has been hired. Admittance will be 5 and under free, 6 and up \$5.00 . Passes are available. The pool has been painted and water will be put in Monday. Should take a day and one half to fill.

Streets/The project in Cedar Hills has come to a stand still since Mike Jarrett of Mountain Houzz looked at the work and asked to walk away from the job and would not charge the town for the work which is of poor quality. Town will re-bid the job and start again.

J. Tolley asked if the town could do anything about the cars leaving Chestnut Street and coming onto the parking lot of the Baptist Church.

Police/The town would like to thank Tracy Landis for her work on controlling traffic on the back street.

Report From Officers of the Town/

C. Clendenin informed council that the flashing lights needed for Eleanor Circle may be discussed at Monday's board meeting and would like to discuss the town purchasing the lights if all other ways are exhausted in paying for them. The town having the smallest budget for this project would like to see if

the Board of Education or the State would pay for them first. J. Tolley said that he would pay for the lights if needed and the town could not. C. Clendenin will see what the board has to say about this first. The state has painted SCHOOL on the streets to note where the slower begins and ends.

She will inform the people that made the complaint.

Lynda asked if the drain had been put in at Carl Hescht's and was informed that it had not.

The mayor informed council that new testing is being required called MS4 Storm Water Sampling and we have asked for a waiver since it is quite expensive. We have less than 100 residents facing Rt. 62.

T. Harmon asked for volunteers for Tuesday evening when she and the STARS group will be planting the town flowers at 6:00 PM
