Police Officer (Part-Time)

Up to 30 Hours a week at \$15.00 an hour.

Candidates MUST be at least 21 years of age and MUST have successfully completed the professional training required for police officers at the WV State Police Academy.

Life Guard (Seasonal)

Up to 40 Hours a week at \$9.00 an hour.

Candidates MUST be at least 16 years of age and have an active Life Guard Certification.

Front Desk/Concession Worker (Seasonal)

Up to 40 Hours a week at \$8.75 an hour.

Candidates MUST be at least 15 years old.

Mowing/Landscape Worker (Seasonal)

Up to 40 Hours a week at \$9.00 an hour.

Candidates MUST be at least 16 years of age and have previous experience with push mowers and weed eaters.
