The meeting began with the Pledge to Allegiance to the Flag.

The minutes of the previous meeting was approved as presented on a motion by T. Harmon, 2nd by J. McLane & carried.

The liability forecast was approved for payment on a motion by J. Tolley, 2nd by K. Childers & carried.

Standing Committees/ The health committee's next meeting will be April 29th, at 7:00 PM.

The Police commission meeting will be April 29th at 6:00 PM.

Health & Police committees have agreed to switch times.

We heard a report from the Park board from April 8th.. Cindy Farley with the Rotary Club is working to get a Porta Pottie for our park. It is fully self efficient and would be a first micro flush toilet in the area. Andrew Parsons and the church group is working to clean up the park. The Food Truck Saturday was a success and they would like to return next year.

The event planning committee would like to report that the Pancake Breakfast and Easter Egg was a success with about 200 attending the breakfast and a park full of children for the hunt.

The History committee obtained a quote from Hillcrest for a Purgula for the back lawn which would be a 16 x 16 at a cost of \$8,350.00 Landscaping would be \$10,730.00 Entire quote for work to be done is \$32,000.00. We will look at this and come back with a plan on May 2nd.

The sewer board met on April 11th & 18th and reported that the generators should be here soon. They reported 3 overages in Nov, Dec. & January with the large amount of rain. They are attempting a settlement with DEP on the MS4 waiver. Will keep posted.

Report from Officers of the Town/Mayor Clendenin has spoken with a tax collection service program to Help collect any B & O taxes due the town. They will take 40% of any tax collected in the past 3 years. We will talk more about this program.
