Ordinance Focus

A focus on ordinance enforcement has continued to be a priority. The Mayor, Chief of Police and the town's prosecutor have worked together to notify property owners that have violated nuisance and yard growth ordinances.

Calls made to the town hall regarding potential ordinance violations are first investigated by the town's health committee and/or mayor to determine the legitimacy of the complaint. If it is determined that the property is in violation of an ordinance, notification letters are then reviewed by the town's prosecutor and delivered by the police chief to correct the violation.

Please report any concerns that you may have regarding our community to the town hall. This is the only way to ensure your complaint is documented and investigated properly.

Tire Clean-Up

A major clean-up project was completed in late June. Over the last several years the town collected over 450 tires. These tires were collected for various reasons by the town with no clear path to dispose of them. Early estimates would have cost the town between \$2 and \$7 to dispose of each tire. Councilwoman Teresa Harmon began working with the Solid Waste Authority and the DEP to find an alternate way for the town to eliminate these tires. Thanks to Teresa's determination at resolving this issue, the town was able to dispose of every tire at zero cost.

ATV's & Golf Carts

In 2014, an ordinance was passed to regulate the operation of ATVs and golf carts in town. Owners and operators of these types of motorized vehicles must be aware of the requirements to safely operate them in town.

A permit must be obtained from the town hall to operate both ATVs and Golf Carts. ATV operators must be 18 or older, and those operating golf carts must be at least 16 years of age.

Both the ATV and golf cart ordinances require operators to yield the right of way to bicyclist and pedestrians.

If the terms of the ordinances are violated, fines and penalties will be levied against the registered owner of the motorized vehicle.

Cardboard & Yard Waste

The town is currently not able to take in yard waste and cardboard.

Earlier this month, the town was notified that cardboard will no longer be recycled and that all cardboard would be taken to the landfill. The cardboard dumpster was removed by the hauling company for this reason.

The town does not have the ability to accept or to dispose of yard waste and other types of brush or clippings at this time. Although these materials were accepted in the past, no formal or approved process was put in place to eliminate these types of materials. Rental Room Update

The town has scheduled a professional cleaning service to clean all three of the town's rental rooms. Once completed, a routine cleaning plan will be put in place to ensure each room is in the best condition possible for any event or renter that wishes to use those spaces.

An option for tables and chairs to be set up has been added to the room rental forms. If you are renting a room and wish to have the tables and chairs in place prior to your arrival, you now have the option to pay \$75 to do so. The fee will cover the labor cost for the town's maintenance crew to perform the set up and take down of the tables and chairs.

Details for other upgrades are being planned. The purchase of new tables, chairs and appliances are included in this year's budget. Announcements will be made once these new items are added.

Community Service Hours

There are many community service opportunities that can be completed right here in town. If you or someone you know is in need to fulfill community service hours for school or any other reason, please contact the town hall.

After adding your name and number to the list, you will be contacted with a list of projects that you can perform. Once tasks are completed, you will be presented with a letter of appreciation and documentation for your community service.

Eleanor Park, Pool & Fairgrounds

Since taking back the area formally known as the Putnam County Park in 2012, the town has prioritized making it a place that everyone can enjoy. These efforts have been successful as we have seen an increased number of users throughout our park.

Many individuals, groups and organizations are using these facilities to host their events and parties. So far in 2019 the park has hosted the West Virginia Food Truck Festival, Haulin' in the Holler, NPLL Softball & Baseball, YMCA Soccer, multiple disc-golf tournaments and horse shows.

The next two months will feature events that will surely increase traffic flow in town and throughout the park. Please be aware of this increased traffic during the Putnam County Fair between July 13th and July 20th. Also between August 2nd and August 4th during the WV JeepFest.

Both of these events require paid admission and access to the fairgrounds during those dates will be unavailable to walkers, joggers and disc golfers. The remainder of the park will be open as normal but be prepared for more vehicle traffic than normal.
