State of WV Purchasing Card

On September 26th members of our town government and staff received training from the WV State Auditor's Office on their Purchasing Card Program.

Over the next month the town will phase out using a standard business credit card and will begin using the credit card issued through the Auditor's office. This program will allow our town to have greater accountability of how the town's money is spent, a higher rebate on purchases and will allow us to pay our vendors and suppliers at point of purchase instead of paying invoices at a later date.

Wildlife Services

The town has entered in a new contract with the United States Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services. Homeowners will need to contact the Wildlife Services directly if you are experiencing issues with wild animals around your property. Putnam County Rotary Club Community Service Project

Volunteers from the Putnam County Rotary Club finalized a community service project last month in Eleanor Park. The project brought in volunteers from all over the county to build a comfort station. The special design of this restroom uses microflush valves and a rain harvesting system to eliminate unpleasant odors and the need for water hookups. This comfort station is the 7th one installed throughout USA by Rotary Clubs and it resembles the one recently installed at Pipestem State Park.

The comfort station is located near the hiking trail head on Park Road and is now open to be used by our park visitors.

Public Hearing Regarding Town Election Management

During the Town Council Meeting on September 19th a public hearing was on the agenda to hear opinions from residents on possibly having the County Clerk's Office administer our town elections. A notice for the public hearing was posted in the September newsletter. Council did not receive any visitors or comments regarding this topic. A town vote must occur for any change to be made to our elections. The discussion of adding such a question to the 2020 ballot has been tabled and will be discussed again at a later date.
