Standing Committees/

Park Committee Report/ All pool staff have been hired and the pool will open up on Memorial Day Weekend. Discussion on a potential land donation for a small park has been put off until the next meeting.

Sewer & Storm Water Report/ Sewer discussed wanting to meet with Council regarding the Relief Act funding. Mayor Clendenin will look into setting up a date for this to take place after more information is known on the guidelines on how the funds can be used. Storm Water Board also discussed a new application system for residents to request work to be performed to help in standing water/drainage issues. This is not yet in place but will be discussed more at their next meeting.

Police Committee/Chief Wingo gave several updates on nuisance complaints that have been received and the action taken on them so far. Bo Evans with the Governors Highway Safety Program will be in town soon to discuss and review the equipment that the town has and the potential acquisition of new equipment.

Report from Officers of the Town/

Mayor Clendenin will attend a presentation regarding the Relief Act Funding tomorrow morning in Charleston. He will discuss the information learned at that meeting during the first council meeting in June.

Miscellaneous and Unfinished Business/

The town will move forward advertising the sell of two vehicles. The Crown Vic will be taken to the Career and Technical Center and dropped off since they are the owners of that vehicle. Mayor Clendenin will try and have this ad ready for the paper on Monday.

Alicia Gray was on the agenda but not in attendance. Mayor Clendenin informed council that her question was answered prior to the meeting so she did not attend. Her request was to open a business on her property, after reviewing the ordinances, she was approved to do so. She was directed to apply for a town business license and a building permit before she would place the new building on her property.
